- 2007 : the « Blue paper » , an Action plan and the European Council conclusions

- European Maritime Day (2008, 2009, 2010)

Action Plan : 65 initiatives. Today we focus on jobs and education

The content of « Europe 2020 »

PRIORITIES:

- ✓ Smart growth: economy based on knowledge and innovation
- ✓ Sustainable growth: low carbon, resource efficient and competitive economy
- ✓ Inclusive growth: high employment economy, social and territorial cohesion

COMMON TARGETS:

- 1. 20-64 people, 75% employed;
- 2. EU GDP to R&D = 3%;
- 3. 20/20/20 climate/energy targets
- 4. 40% younger generation having a tertiary degree, <10% early school leavers
- 5. <20.M people at risk of poverty
- European/national targets and continuous monitoring

Europe 2020 (2)

Flagships initiatives:

- 1. innovation Union
- 2. **youth on the move**
- 3. a digital agenda for Europe
- 4. resource efficient Europe
- 5. an industrial policy for the globalisation era
- 6. **an agenda for new skills and new jobs**
- 7. European platform against poverty

A survey on employment

- Shortage of workforce in the sea-sustained sectors
 - No more life-long career commitment
 - Ageing working population
 - Scarce availability of highly qualified workers
- ❖ Jobseeker looks for a safe workplace, career opportunity and attractive working conditions
- Match skills with jobs : responsibility of social partners and educational centres

What is new in the vocational education

Initiatives:

- Youth on the move
- New skills for new jobs

New tools:

- The European Qualifications Framework for long life learning and the European credit system for vocational education and training

Avenues to explore

Sea-sustained sectors are facing specific difficulties

What can we do :

- Explore new fields : a green shipping industry, blue growth, marine biotechnology, offshore energy, ...;
- Create a level playing field (role of IMO and ILO);
- Get a highly qualified and skilled workforce;
